Short Bio

Roberto Nardi received a degree in archaeology from the University of Rome and in conservation at the Istituto Centrale per il Restauro in Rome. In 1982 he founded the Centro di Conservazione Archeologica, a private company acting under public commission in the field of archaeological conservation. He has directed more than 50 projects and training courses in 15 countries, including the Arch of Septimus Severus in the Roman Forum, the Capitoline museum and the Crypta Balbi in Rome. In 2015 he received the Europa Nostra Award 2015 for the conservation of the prehistoric sculptures of Mont'e Prama and in 2017 for the conservation of the mosaic of the Transfiguration in the monastery of Saint Catherine in Sinai. In 2016 he received the Best in Heritage Award for the Monteprema project. He joined ICCM in 1983 and became vice president in 1989. He is founder member of the ICCM Foundation and president since 2014.
