





15th ICCM Conference Athens, October 20-24, 2025

First Circular

The 15th Conference of the International Committee for the Conservation of Mosaics (ICCM) will be held in Athens, Greece, October 20-24, 2025, at the invitation of the Directorate of Conservation of Ancient and Modern Monuments (DCAMM), Hellenic Ministry of Culture.

In its triennial conferences ICCM aims to bring together conservators, restorers, archaeologists, art historians and other professionals who work in the public or private sector in the broader area of mosaic conservation, as well as students and recent graduates. In the forthcoming conference in particular, ICCM seeks to empower young professionals by facilitating their participation and networking. Young professionals are encouraged to bring fresh ideas and perspectives that can assist in adapting mosaic conservation practices to the new challenges, thus paving the way for a sustainable future for the preservation of mosaic heritage and the profession.

Theme

"Conservation of Mosaics: current challenges and future prospects"

Cultural heritage faces increasing threats arising from natural hazards, socioeconomic shifts, and global political and cultural changes. The climate change is highly likely to bring weather extremes, while reduced financial resources result in underfunding and neglect. Geopolitical conflicts further intensify these challenges, posing altogether significant threats to cultural heritage.

Given the pressing threats posed to heritage assets, the thematic areas of the conference aim to actively explore strategies for better adaptation and response to current challenges and building capacity for the future.

Papers are invited to address the following thematic areas:

Abstracts & Submission

Abstracts for oral presentations, posters and videos should be submitted in English, through the ICCM Website, before **May 15th, 2024**.

The length of abstracts should not exceed 300 words. Corresponding authors should fill in their full name, affiliation, and contact details (postal and email addresses, phone number). If there is more than one author, please include the names and affiliations of co-authors in the abstract text box.

The abstracts should clearly state how the theme or subthemes of the conference will be addressed.

Corresponding authors will be contacted by the end of **November 2024**, about acceptance of their papers, posters and videos for presentation at the conference.

Language and Translation

The official language of the conference will be English. Simultaneous translation in Greek will be provided.

Papers, and posters will be accepted **only in English** for presentation and publication. Titles and subtitles of **videos** should be **in English**.

Location

Athens is the capital and the largest city of Greece. It is one of the oldest cities in the world with a recorded history of over 3400 years, while its earliest human presence beginning between the 11th and 7th millennia BC. The city was named after Athena, the ancient Greek goddess of wisdom.

Classical Athens was one of the most powerful city-states in ancient Greece. It was a center for democracy, the arts, education and philosophy, and it is regarded as the cradle of Western civilization and the birthplace of democracy.

Crowned by the eternal symbol of Acropolis, the modern city of Athens it is famous for its archaeological treasures, World Heritage monuments and magnificent museums, but it is also a very vibrant European capital that offers all facilities.

The host organization

The Directorate of Conservation of Ancient and Modern Monuments (DCAMM) is a central service of the Hellenic Ministry of Culture, responsible for the protection, preventive conservation, conservation treatment, and final presentation of all historic and artistic works of Greece, from antiquity until nowadays. The objectives of the directorate are to co-ordinate and supervise conservation projects in archaeological sites, monuments and museums, to provide a range of services and consultancy to the local services of the Ministry of Culture on their activities concerning the conservation, care, protection and exhibition of important monuments and collections. It also provides guidance and immediate assistance in cases of emergency, or disaster remedy.

The mosaics' conservation sector at DCAMM is one of the most dynamic with a background of numerous large-scale conservation projects, highly trained and experienced personnel and a continuous presence and participation at the ICCM conferences for over 30 years. Among our major priorities is to endorse contemporary theories and principles, to set and follow national and international policies, to strengthen collaborations, to promote and share knowledge, and finally to get people to know and embrace mosaics conservation.

Venue

The Conference will be held at the <u>Technopolis City of Athens</u>, located in the old gasworks of Athens. This rare industrial monument has been repurposed to offer visitors a glimpse into the city's rich history while providing an immersive cultural experience. With over a million visitors each year, the space is bustling with activity, attracting people of all ages and backgrounds, making it a popular destination in the heart of the city. A wide array of cultural, social, recreational, and educational activities, are organized in the premises of the Technopolis which enhance the quality of life for Athenians and visitors alike.

Today, Technopolis is an integral part of the cultural landscape of Athens, inspiring residents and visitors to come together and celebrate the power of culture.

Conference visits and tours

Pre-Conference Workshop

A pre-conference workshop on advanced documentation techniques, including photogrammetry and other image-based applications, will be organized on October 19 and 20 before ICCMs 15th conference in Athens. It is aimed at students and professionals from the conservation community who have a strong interest in documentation and photography and are happy to learn and work with specialized software. A number of **10 participants** will be admitted to the workshop, who are selected based on their application. Participants are invited to bring their camera and laptop, but it is not required.

Introduction to the theoretical content of the of the workshop will be provided through online lectures scheduled during the end of September and the beginning of October.

Application procedure will include the online submission of an application, accompanied by a short CV (2 pages maximum) and a paragraph summing up their motivations.
